2026 Principals' Forums

Abuja, 16 June - The British Council kicked off the BROCLA 2026 week with the Principals' Forum hosted at Regent Secondary School. The forum brought together 87 school leaders and representatives from 49 schools for a day of learning, collaboration and professional dialogue.

Held under the theme 'Future Ready Learners,' the forum provided school leaders with an opportunity to explore how schools can better prepare young people for success in an increasingly dynamic world. Discussions highlighted the importance of strong partnerships between parents, schools, communities and external organisations in equipping learners with the knowledge, skills and values needed for the future.

Lagos, 18 June - The second Principals' Forum was held at Chrisland High School, Opebi, Lagos, where 94 school leaders and representatives from 94 schools gathered to exchange ideas and strengthen collaboration within Nigeria's Cambridge school community.

The forum served as a platform for school leaders to engage in meaningful discussions, share emerging trends and learn from one another as they explored innovative approaches to preparing learners for the future. Building on the theme 'Future Ready Learners,' participants examined the evolving role of schools in nurturing students who are academically strong, adaptable and equipped with the interpersonal and self-management skills required in a rapidly changing global landscape.
